**Christmas at Sea \*the offering for Ministry to Seafarers will be on Sunday, December 19.**

The ministry here has been very interesting these past months, full of almost constant change. Especially of late with the flooding, the rail lines have been shut down and no cargo has been able to go in or out of the port. The lines are opening up again now, but there is a real backlog to tend to. This situation has meant that ships are being delayed - many have to wait out at nearby anchorages, while a few are staying for much longer periods of time at the terminals. It certainly does provide us opportunities to get more well acquainted with those crews who are here for longer periods, and even to arrange worship services on board more often these days - something we haven't been able to do since the Covid pandemic broke out.

With the onset of the new Covid variant of late we are finding that some ships that were beginning to open up a bit again are now being more restrictive again. But reactions vary widely. Last Saturday I was on board 2 ships - one wouldn't allow me to go any further than the top of the gangway, so I was limited to visiting with the few crew who gathered there. The other ship, by contrast, welcomed me into the ship's office, then invited me to the messroom and to stay for lunch to hang out with the crew. Obviously the latter response is preferable as far as I'm concerned. But we go with the flow and adapt as needed.

Again, thank you for your support for this ministry - for my work, and for your thoughts and prayers for the seafarers. Christmas season can be a lonely time for them to be away from family. Pray we can be a real encouragement and support for the crews who spend their holidays here in the Port of Vancouver.

And may our Lord bless you in this Advent and Christmas season as well, and right on into the New Year. Warm regards, *Gary*


