SOLOFINA'S STORY OF CHANGE

COUNTRY: MALAWI

AREA OF IMPACT: ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY



"Since I started the [CCMP] training, I have learned a number of things that have me to transform my household."

Solofina, 45, a wife and mother of five, lives in Masumba village, Malawi. She grows maize and other crops for food and for sale. She is one of the Church in Community (CnC) facilitators in her community who was trained by World Renew's partner, Eagles Relief and Development. She also started participating in the Church Community Mobilization Process (CCMP) training sessions. She says, "Since I started the [CCMP] training, I have learned a number of things that have helped me to transform my household." Solofina is part of the Kachira Bible study group and has been instrumental in mobilizing her church for integral mission; the church has carried out a number of acts of love in the community. She has also been part of the team that trained the community in fertilizer making.

Solofina says she has found CnC to be transformational. She explains, "Before we started these trainings, I did not have cattle... I did not have an oxcart... I did not have goats... a motorbike and an irrigation pump. Now I have them all. I learned to have a vision for my household." Solofina says the training in fertilizer making has helped her to increase her crop productivity and profitability. She shares, "These days my barn is always full, I always have more than enough food." Solofina has now organized a group of young people to observe and learn as she starts a garden for permaculture in her yard so that they too can start gardens of their own.

COUNTRY UPDATES

The planting season in Malawi was already fraught with worry in December, as there were some rains but then nothing for a while. Some people replanted maize after their first crops died. But then, in late January, Storm Ana hit the region and destroyed most of the progress made over the last year. The full extent of the damage is still being determined, but World Renew is already helping hundreds of households with food aide. We will be assessing where else we can respond.

This past year, the price of goods has increased, which has been a struggle for many. Looking at the exchange rate between U.S. dollars and Malawi kwacha, there has been a steady decrease in the kwacha compared to the dollar. Fuel prices increased in December, so the price of goods is increasing as well. People are struggling.

There was a huge increase in the number of COVID-19 cases around the beginning of the year. Even though the cases are still high, the cases have not resulted in hospital stays. This means that the hospitals still can manage and we have not run out of oxygen. Please pray for the health care staff and the hospitals. I know that this has been an exhausting time for them.

PRAYER REQUESTS

- Pray for the recovery of Malawi from Storm Ana, which is known to have killed at least one person in the country and made thousands homeless.
- Pray for food shortages that will result from this extreme weather event.
- Pray for wisdom as we work with partners. We praise God for these local organizations and ask for his guidance to help them build stronger and more efficient organizations that are able to do the work that God has called them to do.

Access to Clean Water

THE COMMUNITY OF TAMARINDO, DIRIAMBA CARAZO

El Tamarindo is a rural community in the dry corridor of Nicaragua in which the majority of the population practices subsistence agriculture. San Lucas has been working in partnership with World Renew for over a decade in this area building community capacity to improve food security, access to clean water, and risk management of new and increased threats posed by climate change. San Lucas and World Renew have also partnered to build five community water systems during the past seven years, successfully helping 415 families improve access to clean water. All of these communities' water systems have been successfully managed by the Community Water Committees that were organized and trained by San Lucas and continue to operate.

THE PROPOSED PROJECT

In response to proposals from the community, an implementation plan has been created to build a new water system. This will roll out in three key activities:

- 1. Construct a solar-powered potable water system.
- 2. Provide training on appropriate hygiene and sanitation practices.
- 3. Empower the Potable Water and Sanitation Committee.

These activities will include components such as workshops to assist families in the community with developing understanding and ownership of the project. Monitoring and follow-up throughout the project are an important part of the plan. And an inauguration celebration will take place once all of these activities have been completed.

The total estimated budget for this project is \$180,418. The community contributions expected from residents of El Tamarindo themselves is \$30,000. Will your congregation commit to raising a portion of these funds to build on the great work that this community is doing?
