#### Nicaragua Water Project Update:

#### Hello to our friends at Nobleford CRC,

I'm excited to report that the water system in El Tamarindo is complete! I was able to attend the inauguration ceremony on Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup> and after listening to lots of speeches, watching some traditional folk dancing, eating a delicious fried snack, and taking a big group picture ... I snuck away with a family who lived close by and got to see the main attraction: water flowing from the tap at their house!

On the day of the celebration, the water was only fully connected and running for half of the families. The other half of the system was still getting cleaned out and the water meters needed to get hooked up. However, this Thursday, Aug 10th, I got official word that 92 out of the 97 houses that will eventually receive water are fully connected and operational and the water project can formally end. (The last 5 families can connect as soon as they finish their work/financial contributions that goes to the local Water Committee.) The involvement of 92 families and over 400 people is such an impressive result, especially since the project started with 60 families who believed in the vision, organized, and started working together to make it happen. Those families modeled hard work and unity, encouraged others to join, and the number grew until more and more families were integrated. Now, the entire community share the fruits of success after a little over 18 months of hard work (although it actually started a few years early!).

Just a reminder of all the work that went into this project:

- More than 3 years of training for the leaders of the Community Water Committee
- Around 10 community assemblies, as well as door-to-door house visits to explain the project and organize the community together
- Hydrological and environmental studies to identify the well site.
- LOTS of advocacy, paperwork, meetings, and coordination with local authorities to get all of the licenses, permissions, and land titles in order to drill the well and ensure that the well, the solar panels, the pump, and the water tank are all on community-owned land.
- Thousands of hours of work hand-digging trenches and then laying over 3 kilometers of pipes
- Construction of two 3 meter concrete columns to create aerial passages, a 2 meter concrete base for the storage tank.
- Installation of the solar panels and pump (not to mention all of the work required to *acquire* the system since it was held up in customs for months)
- The construction and installation of 92 concrete water meter boxes still 5 left to go! (but that is up to the water committee once those families finish their contributions).

Also, I want to share that World Renew, Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) and the community of El Tamarindo were basically equal financial partners in providing the resources to finish this project! The total cost was approximately US\$150,000. World Renew with your partnership provided 33%, the community contributed another 27% (primarily through their labor), and MCC contributed 40%. What a blessing to work together to bring God's Kingdom!
